As early as 2002, HKFYG has begun researching and analyzing the trend of teenagers using the Internet. The concerned project was implemented from January 2016 to December 2017 and provided systematic media literacy curriculum to junior secondary students of 20 secondary schools. The project aimed at cultivating young people’s media literacy by developing their knowledge in analysing online information and establishing positive values. The project also provided professional training to teachers and parents, so that teenagers’ media literacy could be enhanced with diversified support. This helped the non-Chinese speaking students learn Chinese more effectively (including vocabulary, listening and speaking, reading and writing skills), develop their ability to self-learn, increase learning motivation and enhance their attitude towards Chinese learning, so that they have more and better opportunities on further studies and employment as well as integrate better into Hong Kong society.
